### Meet Our New Deputy in Florida

In the last issue of The Bulletin, it was announced that Ill.: Robert L. Goldsmith, 33° and SGIG in Florida has passed away on January 22, 2010. We are happy to introduce to all members of the Valley of Tampa, Ill.: and M.: W.: Dale I. Goehrig, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Florida as the newly appointed Deputy to the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite in Florida.

Our new Deputy was born in Washington, D.C. in 1938 and grew up in Annapolis, Maryland, Lancaster, Pennsylvania, St. Petersburg, Florida and Pemberton, New Jersey. Ill: Goehrig served three years in the U. S. Air Force Security Service, after which he earned an Associate's Degree from Ocean County College in Toms River, New Jersey and a Bachelor's Degree from the University of Miami.

After ten years in the marine industry, Ill∴ Goehrig spent 30 years in real estate and real estate finance, retiring in 2006. This time was spent in management positions with several major banks and commercial real estate firms. He maintains his real estate broker's and mortgage broker's licenses in the state of Florida.

Our Deputy was Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in Harmony Lodge No. 18 in Toms River, New Jersey in 1966. He transferred his membership to Coconut Grove Lodge No. 258 where he served as Worshipful Master in 1978 and again in 1987. He also served Coconut Grove Lodge as Secretary from 1991-98. member of Clermont Lodge No. 226 and a dual member of Harmony Lodge No. 18 in Toms River, New Jersey.

Ill∴ Goehrig was appointed District Deputy Grand Master in 1982 by M∴W∴ Harvey B. Eddy of the old 29th District. For the next 20 years, he served the Grand Lodge of Florida in various capacities including Junior Grand Deacon in 1985, Grand Sword Bearer in 1988 and as a member/chairman of the Coordinating Committee, Finance and Accounts Committee, LYPMGC Committee, Properties Committee and on the Board of Trustees of our Masonic Home. He was elected Junior Grand Warden in 2006 and was elected and installed as our Grand Master in 2009.

Ill∴ Goehrig was made a Master of the Royal Secret in the Valley of Miami in 1977 and has

served as the presiding officer of the four coordinate bodies. He was invested with the Knight Commander of the Court of Honor in 1981 and coroneted a 33° Inspector General Honorary in 1993. He is also a member of Mahi Shriners, the Miami York Rite, Red Cross of Constantine, Mi-Am-I Grotto and the Royal Order of Scotland. He served two years as Worthy Patron of Temple Chapter, Order of Eastern Star in Miami and is currently an officer in Clermont Chapter Order of Eastern Star.

Ill: Goehrig has been married to his wife, Rebba for 29 years and they are the parents of three sons and four grandchildren.

The Valley of Tampa congratulates our new Deputy in the Orient of Florida and we look forward to his continued service to Freemasonry for years to come.

### History

The year 1934 showed that Scottish Freemasonry was affected, as was all society, by the Great Depression of 1929. Our Valley was visited during its first meeting of the year, held on March 24, 1934, by our Sovereign Grand Commander III. John H. Cowles 33°. At our next meeting held on April 2, 1934 the Valley again re-balloted on 324 candidates in order to keep their petitions active. Only one Convocation was held during the year. The first session was held on June 29, with eight Brothers receiving the 4°-14°. They completed their degrees receiving the 15°-32° on September 3.

Our Executive Committee hired a custodian at \$15 a week to make any needed general repairs, as well as taking care of our degree costumes and floor material used for degree work.

Hillsborough Lodge No. 25 had previously had their charter suspended due to financial problems, as well as been evicted from their building in 1934. The lodge had been meeting in our temple and arranged for the use of our temple to meet with Grand Master, M. W. B. W. Helvenston, and with the lodge's members. The Grand Master met with the members of Hillsborough Lodge and then granted the reinstatement of their charter, together with electing new lodge officers, on April 3, 1934. The lodge also made financial arrangements with the mortgage holder, Acacia Insurance Company, to regain their building, and celebrated by having their first meeting in 1934, on Christmas Day December 25, 1934.
