Fourth through ThirtySecond, provide advancement in philosophical,
historical, and Masonic
knowledge, based on the
three preliminary degrees
of the Master Mason series.



As a speculative science, information regarding Freemasonry, especially Scottish Rite Freemasonry, is not constrained to the ritual material presented in the three Craft Degrees which are entrusted to the Entered Apprentice, Fellow Craft and Master Mason rituals.

The main themes espoused by Craft Masonry that center on liberty, equality and the common welfare are too broad to be so restricted from further explanation. The Scottish Rite degrees are, therefore, inspired and furthered by the heritage, philosophy, religion, freedom and toleration espoused within its own teachings.

Lessons contained in the Entered Apprentice, Fellow Craft and Master Mason Degrees have made a deep and lasting impression on the minds of all Masons. Brothers that elect to resume their quest for further light are drawn to available advanced teachings.

The Scottish Rite endeavors to progress deeper into those mysteries, philosophies, symbols and teachings in an effort to provide a broader context and more complete understanding of the vast treasury of Masonic wisdom and knowledge.

It is not the intent to presume that the Scottish Rite Mason is higher in rank or stature than his Brother Master Mason. Rather, the work continues and the challenge of the Blue Lodge furthers all Brothers to fit themselves as better-informed Masons.

We seek to widen the horizon of human thought, deepen spiritual consciousness and bring to mind a higher plane of excellence. We are dedicated to the constant search for truth that our lives may be enriched by Masonic knowledge, and that we may

be better enabled to disseminate the principles for which our great fraternity stands entrusted.

Our goal is that a beneficial influence is cast upon the lives within the greater community and world around us. By conducting ourselves in such a manner, we wish to encourage a more enlightened society and a better-informed electorate.

Historically, Masons have received recognition as intelligent, refined and trustworthy citizens, defenders of the precepts of the United States Constitution, the Bill of Rights and the Declaration of Independence.

Valley of Tampa History

Sometimes we need to look back and reflect on where it started and how far we've come. Modern Freemasonry began in England in 1717, during the time in history called "The Age of Enlightenment." Because of the very basic principles of equality, a belief in a supreme being, regardless of your individual religious persuasion, truth in all each man's daily life, and finally charity in helping all in need, Freemasonry spread wherever men gathered to improve themselves and the world they lived in. Democracy was very apparent in the American Colonies, and with Masonic influence, led to our nation's freedom and establishment as a republic, basically founded on Masonic principles. This was reflected in the Brothers who became leaders in our fight for freedom, and especially in the writing of all of the major documents establishing our country as a free nation, under GOD. Freemasons were in every phase of our fight for independence.

Our first Masonic Lodge in Florida was established in 1771 as St. Andrews Lodge; however, things proved unfavorable, and all it's members fled to Charleston South Carolina, where in 1787 it became a founding lodge in the Grand Lodge of South Carolina. On July 9, 1830, the Grand Lodge of Florida was formed with a total of 76 Brothers from Jackson Lodge, Harmony Lodge and Washington Lodge. Our Scottish Rite in Florida began with petitions of establishment April 22 and 27, 1853 in Alligator Florida (later changed to Lake City.) This body did not survive the Civil War. The Valley of Tampa, actually began in Plant City on October 16, 1899, when a Lodge of Perfection received its charter. The McLean Chapter of Rose Croix received its charter on August 7, 1899. The Bruce Preceptory of Kadosh received their Charter sometime in 1900, but due to a fire, its charter was lost. Finally, the Tampa Consistory received their charter in 1901, again lost because of a fire. I encourage you to learn more about the history of the Valley of Tampa, by purchasing a copy of the History of the Tampa Scottish Rite Bodies, if you do not have a сору. 🥙

November Meeting


