In the early 1950s in Colorado, the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry of the Southern Jurisdiction of the United States initiated a program to help children with speech and language disorders. The results obtained from this program led to the establishment of RiteCare clinics to provide diagnostic evaluation and treatment of speech and language disorders, as well as learning disabilities.

Today, there are 178 RiteCare® clinics, centers, and special programs operating or planned for children and therapists located throughout the United States. Each facility is staffed by speech-language pathologists or other trained personnel. Through the support of Scottish Rite members, these clinics, centers,

and programs continue to increase. The value of this philanthropy has long been apparent. Tens of thousands of youngsters across the United States have been helped significantly. With the good work of dedicated clinicians and parents, the Scottish Rite has achieved successes that could only be imagined a few years back. Children who might have remained educationally behind for a lifetime can now talk, read, and lead productive lives.

As a rule, the RiteCare® Clinics accept preschool children who have difficulty speaking or understanding the spoken word or school-age children who have difficulty learning to read. Some centers also offer literacy training for adults.

Inquiries on age groups and program offerings in specific areas should be addressed to the director of the local Scottish Rite facility. Equally important, all services are available regardless of race, creed, or the family's inability to pay.

While all children in need are eligible for available RiteCare® Program treatment, please consult with your local facility for specific financial information.

William F. Wyllie, 32° KCCH Wise Master

Brother William F. Wyllie, 32° KCCH was installed Wise Master of the Tampa Chapter Rose Croix in January for the year 2014. Brother Bill is a native Floridian having been born in Clearwater.



His first exposure to Freemasonry was when he received the Initiatory and DeMolay degrees in Paul Revere Chapter (Tampa) in 1951. He later became a Charter Member of Owen A. Coile Chapter (Tampa) and served as Master Councilor in 1957. As a DeMolay he received the Representative DeMolay Award and later was invested with the DeMolay Active Legion of Honor.

He moved to Lakeland, FL where he petitioned Southland Lodge No. 256 and was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on November 26, 1977. He served Southland Lodge as Worshipful Master in 1982. In 1988, he represented M: W: Joseph Shurette as District Deputy Grand Master of the 21st (now 24th) Masonic District. He later served Grand Lodge as Senior Grand Deacon in 1996 for M:W: Michael Padron and is the Grand Representative of the Grand Lodge of Denmark near the Grand Lodge of Florida.

Brother Bill has been very active in the three York Rite bodies where he has served as the presiding officer of Lakeland Chapter No. 21, RAM, Polk Council No 6 R&SM and Lakeland Commandery No. 21 KT. He has also served as the District Deputy of the three Grand York Rite bodies in Florida and in 2005 served as the Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Florida.

He became a Master of the Royal Secret in the Valley of Tampa on May 13, 1978 and was invested with the rank and dignity of a Knight Commander of the Court of Honour on November 5, 2005. He is a member and Past Commander of the Scottish Rite Guard.

Professionally, Brother Wyllie is retired as an accountant, having worked in the citrus and phosphate industries and in public accounting. He is a Diaconal Minister and Treasurer of the Florida Conference of United Methodist Church.

Valley of Tampa History

It hardly seems possible that the year 1914, one hundred years ago, would bring America to prominence in the entire world and become the dominate world power after the completion of WWI. With the end of kings and queens and almost all royalty in Europe. The war that was supposed to end all wars took over ten million lives, and modernization completely in all countries, would change the entire world. The war to end all wars, tuned out not to be such an event. On June 29, 1914, the first step came about with the murder in Sarajevo of the archduke and his wife, and Germany and Austria declared war against Great Britain, France and Russia. The Tampa Tribune published the graphic

pictures of the murders within 72 hours. Tony Janus, who had flown his Banjoist Airboat from St. Petersburg to Tampa two years previously, was in Russia for the Banjoist Airboat Company to sell their airboat, but was killed during a test flight in 1916. America was very much an isolationistic country and very much opposed to becoming involved in the "European War"; however, much of that changed when the HMS Lusitania carrying over 2,000 passengers, of which there were over 200 American citizens, were lost after being torpedoed by a German submarine. In Florida, this caused "war fever" as it was called in those days, to become the main topic.

Scottish Rite had continued to show growth in the entire state. The Supreme Council ordered that the Orient of Florida, due to growth of membership to have three new Deputies of the Supreme Council; Ill. Bruce S. Weeks, 33° of Pensacola, Ill. Clarence S. Hammatt, 33° of Jacksonville and Ill. Olin S. Wright, 33° of Plant City. Completed returns to the Supreme Council showed seven Lodges of Perfection with 755 members. Four Councils of Kadosh with 734 members and three Consistories with 726 members. Honors received in 1913 were nine 32° KCCH, and nine Ill. 33°.

In the Valley of Tampa, elections were held with the following results, Lodge of Perfection Venerable A. W. Windhorst, Chapter of Rose Croix Wise Master E. J. Keefe, Council of Kadosh Commander W. R. Fitts, Consistory Master of Kadosh George P. Sullivan. A motion was made and approved to move from Hillsborough Lodge's Temple to the Peninsular Telephone Co. Building for a monthly rent of \$100. Forty-six new Masters of the Royal Secret were communicated degrees 4° through 32° in 1914.
