The Grand Ballroom

If you recall, in the February 2014 issue of



the Northern Masonic Jurisdiction. His message was both timely and unforgettable. He indicated that only 18 percent of candidates in his state returned to their lodges after they joined the craft, and worse, only eight percent ever became active in their lodges. His thoughts were no less critical when he noted, "What a waste of time and potential resources." This is not exactly a ringing endorsement of the management of Freemasonry in

that state. Perhaps he is not alone.

Think about that for a moment. Eighty-two percent of these Freemasons regularly pay their dues, but don't attend meetings. In a rational world, reasonable leaders would recognize this trend and devote their attention and resources toward finding a solution to this unhealthy situation. It is quite probable that a newly identified disease, known in medical circles as irrational groupthink, has infected many of our current Masonic leaders. They routinely ignore the average member as they blindly continue down a road of self-destruction. From all outward appearances, many of those leaders look at the membership as a row of corn to be harvested to support an ever growing list of their favorite secular world charities. When our Masonic leaders fail to understand why members vote with their feet and do not attend meetings, the very future of the craft is in doubt.

Could this be the reason Masonic membership has decreased in the United States every year since 1959?

Probably.

Director of Work

Dear Brethren, I have furnished the Fall Reunion Schedule to all concerned, beginning on Saturday October 25 for the first day and concluding on Saturday November 1, 2014. I have reworked the degrees

to keep each day ending around 5:30 p.m. I request that all Degree Masters report the members of their cast to Ill. Rusty Glendinning 33°, Ill. John Drewett 33°, and me. If there are no changes in the cast, I still request a notice to all concerned "No changes to cast." For those Degrees that want to use our Temple for practice sessions (only two are allowed), send the request to me, as I keep the requests and therefore can notify the lighting, costumes, floor equipment and sound committees of the "approved dates" you plan to practice. On the day of your conferral, you are to have each member of your cast with a mike, on the floor before the degree to check each mike, this is very important. It is the responsibility only of the Degree Master to check the proper floor set up. I ask that you inform the rest of the cast to check their mikes and then go back into the anti-room until the degree goes on the floor to confer the degree. Degree Master must turn in the name or names of the temporary candidate or candidates to the Class Director staff prior to the degree conferral. Please have a prompter for your degree to assist your cast. If there are any questions or if you need assistance please send me an email, or call me.

Valley of Tampa History

Continuing the year 1915, a committee was formed to look for a site for a permanent home with it as our own building. The committee reported two sites had been recommended, the first at Lafayette Street and Jefferson at a cost of \$12,500 and the second site located at Madison and Marion Streets. at a cost of \$40,000. During the meeting held on December 6, 1915, it was announced that the Sover-

eign Grand Commander III. George F. Moore 33°, had re-appointed III. Olin S. Wright 33°, as Deputy of the Supreme Council for Florida. Brothers J. L. Young and Brother A. S. Scheider honorary 33° at the Annual Session in 1915.

Elections for the year 1916 were held on January 3, 1916 as follows: Consistory – George P. Sullivan, 33°, Master of Kadosh; Council of Kadosh – Wilmot Fitts, 33°, Commander; Chapter Rose Croix – E. J. Keefe, 32° KCCH, Wise Master; Lodge of Perfection – Franklin Heinrich, 32° KCCH, Venerable Master. Installation Ceremonies were conducted on January 31, 1916 by Ill. Olin S. Wright, 33°, Deputy as the Installing Officer.

Immediately after the Ceremonies, a motion was moved and passed to change all meetings to be held on Monday nights, on a weekly basis. The Spring Convocation was concluded with 42 new Masters of the Royal Secret, with Ill. Olin S. Wright, 33°, Deputy, consecrating the Class. On June 5, 1916 Brother E. J. Keefe, 32° KCCH, was elected Wise Master of the Chapter of Rose Croix, and on July 3, 1916 elected Commander of the Council of Kadosh. The Report of the Finance Committee showed total assets of \$ 28,593.94 and liabilities of \$1,049.75.

The Fall Convocation began on October 17, 1916 and concluded on 35 candidates received the 19° through 30° with the degrees beginning at 9:00 a.m. and concluding at 11:00 p.m. The Convocation concluded on October 20, with 35 new Masters of the Royal Secret consecrated by Ill. Olin S. Wright, 33°, Deputy.
