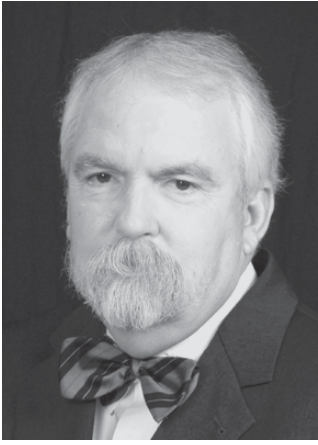

## Member Education & Director of Work

Our Spring Reunion is April 22 and April 29. Preparations are well underway. A preliminary schedule of our Work is included elsewhere in the Bulletin.

A highlight for a Spring Reunion is always the conferral of the 20th Degree, Master of the Symbolic Lodge; its conferral is always professional and impressive.

This Degree, like all others, is rich in symbolism and allegory, especially with numerology. This particular degree serves as a reminder and refresher of our duties as Masons, leaders and citizens. It does so simply, directly and clearly.

Three great pillars of Freemasonry—Toleration, Justice and Truth—are prominently presented to supplement the three pillars of the Blue Lodge. As the degree progresses we are reminded of nine important virtues by which to govern our conduct.

Albert Pike notes that this degree represents Masonry in its primitive purity, “in which it was not necessary to torture the mind to discover reasonable interpretations.” Simple truths and principles are presented and strive “to *prepare* men to govern themselves.” Pike's lecture in *Morals and Dogma* is of a similar vein—simple, and uncharacteristically short; its reading prior to the Reunion is to be commended.

Pike's lecture, and this degree, remind us that Masonry is not about accumulating titles or conducting pageantry. We are Scottish Rite Masons to find inspiration from the enlightened wisdom of the ages; to develop and maintain good habits and manners; practice virtue and philanthropy, to build a “moral edifice of knowledge.” This degree reminds us of our duties as Instructors, Directors and Architects; that Masonry beckons us to put all we have learned to good practical use in our lives.

The 20th Degree is refreshing reminder of what it means to be a Mason. It is well worth the effort to attend the Reunion.

Reserve your calendar for these special education events and degree conferrals:

March 11, the Feast of Kadosh; March 30, a study of the 4th Degree at Corinthian Lodge No. 191; July 10, conferral of the 13th Degree at our monthly meeting; and August 14, conferral of the 8th Degree.
