Brother W. Allen Sorbie 32° was elected to serve as the Valley of Tampa's Master of Kadosh for the year 2019. Allen's early life was a unique one for a young man. He was born in Connecticut, however his parents moved back to Scotland when he was four. At the age of seventeen, he returned to the United States and served in the US Navy. Following his tour of duty in the Navy, he returned to the UK. Figuring the third time was a charm, he returned to the United States, this time to Sarasota in 1999 and has remained here since then. Our Master of Kadosh is employed by a tax service company and is their Director of Information Security.

Our Master of Kadosh petitioned Caledonian Lodge of Uganda No. 1389, of the Grand Lodge of Scotland to receive the Three Degrees of Freemasonry and was Raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on November 23, 1994. He became a Dual Member of The Builder's Lodge No. 376 in 2005 and served that Lodge as Worshipful Master in 2008. With the merger of The Builder's Lodge and Cary B. Fish Lodge No. 346, he was elected Treasurer of Phoenix Lodge No. 346 in 2013 and has served in that position through 2018. He is also a Plural Member of Liberty Lodge No. 412, West Coast Lodge No. 409 and the Florida Lodge of Research. He has served the Grand Lodge of Florida as a member of various Grand Lodge committees and was installed as District Deputy Grand Master of the 27th Masonic District in 2014, representing M.: W.: James W. Ford.

He petitioned the Valley of Tampa and became a Master of the Royal Secret in the Valley of Tampa in 2006. Since that time he has been a member of the cast in the 5th, 9th, 14th, 20th and 28th Degrees. He is also a Past President of the Sarasota Scottish Rite Club, serving in that position in 2012.

Brother Allen has been very active in the York Rite Bodies, where he has served as Excellent High Priest of Manatee River Chapter in 2014, Illustrious

Master of the Council of Royal & Select Masters in 2015 and is currently the Eminent Commander of Trinity Commandery No. 16. He has also served as the DDGHP of the Grand Chapter RAM of Florida and is the Grand Captain of the Guard for the Grand Council of R&SM of Florida. 🐾

Brother Richard Stewart Cowan, 32° KCCH was elected to serve the Tampa Council of Kadosh as its Commander for the year 2019. Brother Cowan was born in Steubenville, Ohio to Scottish Immigrant parents. He attended public schools in Steubenville and graduated from high school in 1949. In addition to his public schooling, Brother Cowan has also had professional schooling in city, state and federal law enforcement oriented training. From 1949-1961 he was employed by the Wheeling Steel Corporation in Steubenville. From 1958-1961 he also served as a member of the Police force in Brilliant, Ohio. In 1961, the Cowan family moved to Tampa, Florida where he served on the City of Tampa's Police Force from 1961-1981, retiring with the rank of Captain.

He petitioned Steubenville Lodge No. 45 to receive the Three Degrees of Freemasonry and was Raised on June 7, 1958. He affiliated with John Darling Lodge No. 154 as a Dual Member in 2014 and has completed the Master Mason I, II & III Exams. He petitioned the Scottish Rite, in Ohio and became a Master of the Royal Secret in November 1958. After his move to Tampa, he affiliated with the Valley of Tampa in March 1976. For his dedication to the Craft, he was invested with the Rank and Dignity of a Knight Commander of the Court of Honour in 2015. He is a member of Egypt Shrine and the Royal Order of Scotland and received his 60-Year Award in John Darling Lodge this year and is also a 50-Year member of the Scottish Rite. 🐾



Member Education & Director of Work

Plans for our 2019 ritual work and education programs are shaping up—it is a continuous process. Our Spring Reunion is May 18 and 19. The Fall Reunion is October 26 and

27. Please note that both Reunions are one-weekend events.

During the year, we will confer at least four degrees at our meetings (these degrees are not conferred at Reunions):

- Confidential Secretary, the 6th Degree on March 11
- Prince of Mercy, the 26th Degree on May 13
- Royal Arch of Solomon, the 13th Degree on July 8
- Intendent of the Building, the 8th Degree on August 12.

By the end of 2019, we expect to have proficient teams for all degrees!

The 6th Degree is next on the calendar and is a part of the Lodge of Perfection. Among other things, the Lodge of Perfection teaches virtue-ethics, what kind of men we should be; and duty-ethics, how we should act and what we should be doing or not doing. Confidential Secretary focuses on the former—what kind of men we should be.

The 6th Degree is also a demonstration of Freemasonry's propensity to create degrees with little factual or historical basis. A story is created, on the slimmest of evidence, to espouse or teach some important lesson. Some degrees are simply “made-up,” e.g., the second section the Master Mason Degree.

The plot of the 6th Degree originates from a few verses in the Volume of Sacred Law, “And when Hiram came out from Tyre to see the cities which Solomon had given him; and they pleased him not. And he said, what kind of cities are these which thou hast given me, my brother?” I Kings 9:12-13 (KJV).

A quite spirited discussion ensues between Solomon and Hiram—in the degree, not in the VSL. The VSL

moves on to other issues; but our ancient brethren extended the story line to provide instruction to us.

A result or takeaway of the degree is its valuable instruction in virtue-ethics. We are to be the “peace-maker.” To this we must be even-tempered, faithful and benevolent.

Albert Pike explains in *Morals and Dogma*, a Mason is “...to quiet, instead of aggravating difficulties ...to keep friends from becoming foes, and to persuade foes to become friends. To do this, he must needs (sic) control his own passions, and be not rash and hasty, nor swift to take offence, nor easy to be angered.”

Control our passions—that sounds familiar. Developing self-control is one step along our journey to becoming virtuous men. Confidential Secretary inculcates that principle.

The degree is well conferred by Sarasota Lodge No. 147 and your attendance is earnestly solicited on March 11. An advance reading of the degree's chapter in *Bridge to Light* is recommended to enhance the experience. 🙏
