Rite Masons to participate in. We begin on March 21st with our 6th Annual Feast of Kadosh. You will find information of this event on the cover of this issue of the Bulletin. I encourage you to attend this Feast along with family and friends. As I have said to others, this is not your typical Masonic Roast Beef dinner. You have a choice of entrees, a wonderful setting, a great keynote speaker and participation in seven Toasts that fit the occasion. I encourage each of you to make plans to attend the Feast of Kadosh.

Next on the calendar is our Annual Ceremony of Renewal and Remembrance on April 13, 2020. This is an obligatory observance sponsored by the Chapter of Rose Croix, where members of the Chapter of Rose Croix celebrate both the beginning and end of life. The ceremony is open to one and all as we honor those members of the Chapter of Rose Croix have left our midst in the past year.

The third event is our Spring Reunion in memory of Ill. Girard G. Etheridge, Jr., 33°. Ill Our Illustrious Brother was a dedicated worker in Freemasonry. Now is the time to talk with your Blue Lodge brethren about taking that additional step in Freemasonry by becoming a member of this Spring Class. The Reunion will be held Mary 2 and 3. Petitions may be obtained from the office or from the Valley's website.

Speaking of our website, thanks to our webmaster, Brother Brian Campbell, 32° KCCH, we are in the process of revamping and improving our place on the internet. We are not done with the changes, but we have updated the look and ease of the website and are looking at having a "members" only section. In the near future we look to provide our members with the availability of making reservations and purchasing their tickets for our monthly dinners. As the Personal Representative, it is my duty to report to each of you the status of your Valley. While we had great attendance and participation in our events in 2019, there were other things that we need work on. At the present time, we have 2,217 members. In 2019, we lost 139 members by death. While we have no direct control over

deaths, we do have direct control over bringing new brothers into the Scottish Rite. In addition, we had 115 brothers suspended for non-payment of dues or were suspended in their Particular Blue Lodge. As you can see, just to cover the number of suspensions in 2019, our 2020 Reunions need to average 58 candidates in each Reunion. There are 61 Lodges in the 14th, 18th, 19th, 20th, 21st and 23rd Districts, which comprise the Valley of Tampa. (There is some overlap with the Valleys of Ocala and Ft. Myers,) but we have membership in each of those 61 Lodges. Just one new Master of the Royal Secret from each of these Lodges in each Reunion would bring us 122 new Masters of the Royal Secret in 2020. Broken down that way, it does not seem as an unsurmountable task. I hope that you will join me in working toward this goal for 2020.

Brethren, in closing, I would like to thank each of you for what you are doing to promote our great Fraternity. I know that each of us have other obligations in our daily lives, but I sincerely believe that Freemasonry is always with you each day. The Auditorium has built in seating for 700, also has an orchestra pit which could accommodate additional seating for up to 100 based on preferred set up. The Auditorium is great for large ceremonies, productions, trainings or business presentations, just to name a few. Spotlights, full sound, front and rear projection visual options.

The Scottish Rite Foundation Helps Children

Robert D. Davidson, 33° Wise Master of the Chapter of Rose Croix

Ill∴ Robert D. Davidson, 33° was elected to serve as Wise Master in the Tampa Chapter, Rose Croix for the year 2020. Ill∴ Davidson is a native of



Indianapolis, IN, having been born in 1951. He received his public education in Perry Township Schools of Marion County, graduating from Southport High School in 1969. After high school, Ill∴ Bob attended Purdue University, graduating with a B.S. in Mathematics, and Indiana University, graduating with a B.A. in Chemistry. After graduation, he was employed at Western Electric. When AT&T decided to divest its assets, he joined the management team at Printed Wiring, a PCB manufacturer, as Vice President of Engineering and Quality.

Our Wise Master began his Masonic journey when he was initiated into Southport Chapter, Order of DeMolay, Indianapolis, IN in 1968. He received the Three Degrees of Freemasonry in Southport Lodge No. 270, Southport, IN in the spring of 1977. In the fall of 1977, he became a Master of the Royal Secret in the Valley of Indianapolis and immediately became active in the music department singing in the men's chorus and appointed as an associate organist for the Valley.

Ill∴ Davidson continued to study music throughout his time living in Indianapolis. He started piano studies at the age of 6 and started organ studies at the age of 15. His love developed for the theatre organs of the silent movie era and was fortunate to study with several of the organists that performed through that period of history. After joining the Scottish Rite, he was introduced to Dr. Mallory Bransford, organist chairman for the Scottish Rite and Dean of the Organ Department at Butler University. He began his studies on classical organ and Masonic music with Dr. Bransford and became his assistant at Zion Evangelical United Church of Christ. Our Wise Master relocated to the Largo area in 1991, working in several of the PCB Shops in the area. He joined Star Lodge No. 78 in Largo, where he has served as Worshipful Master in 2003 and 2016. He currently serves the Lodge as Secretary. He has also served the Grand Lodge of Florida as Grand Musician in 2014 and 2016 and numerous committees over the years. He affiliated with the Valley of Tampa in 1996 and has served as Organist for the Valley for the past eleven years. For his work and dedication to the fraternity, he was invested with the rank of Knight Commander of the Court of Honour in 2011 and Coroneted a 33° Scottish Rite Mason in 2019.

William C. Sundquist, 32° KCCH Venerable Master of the Lodge of Perfection



Brother William (Bill) Carl Sundquist, 32° KCCH was elected to serve the Tampa Lodge of Perfection as its Venerable Master for

the year 2020. Brother Bill was born in 1969 in Worcester, MA. He graduated from Dr. Leo T. Doherty Memorial High School in 1987. After high school, he attended Dartmouth College in Hanover, NH, graduating in 1992 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Engineering Science and in 1993 he received a Bachelor of Engineering degree from Dartmouth's Thayer School of Engineering. He has worked for the United States Postal Service since 2007, currently as an EEO Services Analyst.

Our Venerable Master began is Masonic journey when he petitioned Nitram Lodge No. 188 in 2009. He served his Lodge as Worshipful Master in 2014 and 2019. In 2014 and 2015, he was the District Instructor for the 21st District and in 2016, he was installed District Deputy Grand Master of the 21st District, representing M: W: Stanley L. Hudson. In 2017 he served the new 18th District as District Instructor and since 2019 has been the Zone 4A Chair for the Committee On Work.

Cicero and Freemasonry

Our ancient brethren were well-read. The results of their reading and reflection found their way into both our Blue Lodge and Scottish Rite degrees. The lessons and wisdom of the sages are

offered to us in a theatrical, but scholarly fashion. We should be grateful.

Marcus Cicero (106-43 BCE) has been included frequently in my columns as a likely source for Masonic ideas, for example, lessons on the four cardinal virtues, politics and ethics. He was the Roman equivalent of Plato, a man of philosophical learning, a brilliant writer and statesman. The Founders of our country admired him for his character and principled political life.

Beyond politics and philosophy, Cicero offers sage advice on matters of life. A good example is his work *On Old Age*. Unlike Plato, who wrote using abstractions and theories, Cicero used historical figures. *On Old Age* is a dialogue between Marcus Porcius Cato, Publius Cornelius Scipio and Laelius (the historical contributions of these figures, and their ancestors, are worthy of investigation in their own right), in which Cato, an old man, schools the younger two on the merits of properly considering old age. He encourages their search for wisdom, their continuous education and their active participation in the life of their city. He also makes a case for the immortality of the soul.

Cicero's advice to the young men may have found its way into our Masonic ritual and is wellsummarized in the Master Mason lecture.

We can a learn a lot by attending and participating in our degrees and by the frequent study of the ritual. We may never know who is really speaking to us— Cicero, Plato, Confucius, Aristotle, some Zen Master, Immanuel Kant, Edmund Burke or Solomon. The source of the great ideas, thoughts and lessons is not so relevant. What is important, as Cicero taught the young men, is that we continue to grow, learn and act so that, in old age, we may enjoy that "happy reflection consequent to a well-spent life."
