### THE LODGE OF PERFECTION

The 4th through the 14th Degrees comprise the "Lodge of Perfection." They are known as the "Ineffable Degrees" because their, "Purpose is the investigation and contemplation of the ineffable Name of Deity." Ineffable comes from the Latin meaning, that which should not be spoken. This was a Jewish belief because our language is incapable of describing our God. In the 14th Degree lecture, Pike tells us, "The Deity is thus not an object of knowledge, but of faith; not to be approached by the understanding, but by the moral sense; not to be conceived, but to be felt."

The ineffable degrees are built upon the legend of Hiram Abiff as found in the 3rd, or Master Mason Degree, of the symbolic lodge. This legend forms the Masonic tradition from which our Lodge of Perfection Degrees emanate. It is tradition, not necessarily factual history. We are more concerned with the opportunities for symbolic instruction than with historical accuracy. Hiram appears in 1 Kings, where we are told he finished all of his work and returned to his own country. Our Hiramic Legend tells his story differently; this is done to teach us lessons, symbolically. Pike tells us, "Whatever Hiram really was, he is a type ... perhaps humanity in its highest phase; an exemplar of what man may and should become."

The death of the Master is mourned for an appropriate time and then the work is continued on the Temple with Hiram's responsibilities assigned to various others. The search for the assassins is also begun, all of whom being captured and caused to suffer their due rewards. The legend dealing with Solomon and the Temple are then merged with an even older legend dealing with Enoch, one of the earliest patriarchs. It is discovered that Soloman's Temple is being built near the ruins of an earlier temple built by Enoch where a secret yault is discovered.

The legend of the Ineffable Degrees ends in triumph and disaster: the Temple is completed, the sacred Name of Deity is discovered, and the Perfect Elus are created. However, Solomon parts ways with the Lord, beginning to sacrifice to other gods and the majority of the people follow him into apostasy. Only the Perfect Elu's maintain the true faith and continue to teach with scrupulous purity the knowledge of the true God. As punishment from God, Israel is conquered by Nebuchadnezzar and taken away in captivity and the Temple is destroyed. The legend is then continued in the Rose Croix degrees with the rebuilding of the Second Temple.

The religious lessons of the Ineffable Degrees culminate in the realization that the ineffable name of Deity is a symbol of the ineffable, or indescribable, nature of God. The virtues of man are the qualities of God imperfectly demonstrated. Our reason is not His reason, but merely a mirror on the illimitable mind that creates, preserves, and changes the universe. We travel on the path to perfection, to further light, with humility because He has seen fit to show us that path and guide us by the surest route, manifested in the lives and teachings of the great philosophers, teachers, and prophets of the world.





### **PRELATE**

"Goliath stood and shouted to the ranks of Israel," Why do you come out and line up for battle? Am I not a Philistine, and are you not servants of Saul? Choose a man and have him come down to me. If he is able to fight and kill me, we will become your subjects; but if I overcome him and kill him, you will become our subjects and serve us." Then the Philistine said, 'This day I defy the ranks of Israel! Give me a man and let us fight each other." On hearing the Philistine's words, Saul and all the Israelites were dismayed and terrified." I Samuel 17:8-11

We all know the story of David and Goliath. It comes from 1 Samuel 17. The Philistines and the Israelites have been at war seemingly forever. On this particular day, the two armies face each other across the valley of Elah. Out steps the Philistine champion, Goliath of Gath, whose height was over nine feet tall. He wore a bronze helmet, and his bronze coat of armor weighed 125 pounds. He carried a javelin with a spearhead weighing 15 pounds. The Israelites were amazed and in great fear! Who wouldn't be?

When we hear this story, or any story of wars and battles, we, as men, get all pumped up. We love good battles. We love to overcome. We understand the thrill of victory and the agony of defeat. But what stops us from overcoming, or even going to battle? Our Goliaths! Dismayed and terrified. There it is—fear. Fear is the most debilitating emotion to man's masculinity. It robs us of what we feel it means to be a man. The Israelites encountered their giant and it scared them to death.

Every man has a Goliath. Every man faces a giant at some point during their life. But every man must contend with those giants if he is going to press on and experience a life-transforming relationship with God. Your giant could be intellectual doubt. You want to believe in God and Faith and Mercy and Forgiveness. But what about all the evil around us? The wars, the famine, the crimes we see or hear about every day. How can there be a God with all of this surrounding us daily? You have unanswered questions and nagging doubts about God and the Bible. You are not alone. Your giant could be fear, pride, lust, or anger. Everyone is afraid of something. As for pride, we want to be in total control of ourselves and our lives. Maybe you battle with lust which causes you deep shame because you want to be faithful to your wife or partner. And we all deal with anger, probably on a daily basis. What are we to do? Be like David!

David looked at Goliath, not through human eyes, but with God's eyes. Fear was turned into faith through God's strength. David "declared that the battle belonged to the Lord." David ran toward Goliath instead of shrinking away as the other Israelites did. David pursued God's plan for his life. David kept his focus on God. We should want to be men like David—running toward our Goliaths. Always keeping our focus on God and letting God's strength, not our own, win the battle for us.
